CHURCHILL

School-Wide

It will be implemented by Instructional Support teachers Mrs. Colon and Ms. Tirrell with a small group of pre-selected struggling 4th and 5th grade readers. A breakfast meeting was held for the parents of these students to introduce the program and to strengthen the home-school connection.

6th Grade

The "Too Good Program" was infused in Social Studies and Writing classes on a weekly basis. Officer Lou and our "Too Good" program was written up in the L.E.A.D. Newsletter

5th Grade

The Grade 5 HEP students participated in a Problem Solving competition attended by students from Roseland, Essex Fells, Livingston, Newark, Caldwell, West Caldwell, and Millburn. Fairfield had a student on each of the first, second, and third place teams.

4th Grade

Students are putting on their detective hats when using context as a clue to the meaning of a word or phrase in language arts.
