B. <u>Good News</u>

Churchill

- During the Week of Respect, a guest speaker came to speak about diversity, respect, acceptance, and perseverance. Ms. Dawer, the school counselor, also visited the classrooms to do lessons on anti-bullying and conflict resolution. Students participated in a respect/anti-bullying poster contest as well. The most exciting activity for students were creating a human peace sign with 270 students and teachers.
- Churchill School's Student Council collected toiletries for the victims of Hurricane Harvey. Classroom representatives were elected and ready to serve their school and community. We are looking forward to a productive year.

• During the Week of Respect, the students turned the hallways into "Walls of Respect" with writing and illustrations. Mrs. Pilato, the school counselor, visited the classrooms to teach lessons on Respect, specifically how to follow the

"Golden Rule." Third grade students heard the story, <u>The Invisible Boy</u>, and discussed how children feel when they are left out of activities. The students brainstormed ways on how to include children who may feel "invisible" on the playground and in the cafeteria. Students in each grade level were challenged to show EXTRA respect in the cafeteria. Those students who exemplified what it means to show respect were recognized with a special certificate.

- Third grade students have already finished their first novel, <u>The Miraculous</u> <u>Journey of Edward Tulane</u>, and are already eager to start their next, which is <u>Winn-Dixie</u>. Both novels are a part of an author study of Kate DiCamillo. Projects completed by the students on Edward Tulane are displayed in the hallways.
- There are 25 third graders participating in Student Council this year. They met for the first time on October 6. The first project will be a book collection for the Vietnam Veterans of America. Each Stevenson School student will be asked to send in one book from their home library during the week of October 16-20. After the weekly collection, each student will choose a "new book" to take home. All other books will be collected by the veterans. The goal is to reach 750 books.
- The entire first grade class walked to the Fairfield Public Library. They explored the shelves of the children's library section and were read a story by the librarian.
- Kindergarten students have been busy learning about apples and pumpkins. They participated in an apple taste test and created graphs with the results. A culmination of the study will be a field trip to Fairfield Farms where children will enjoy pumpkin picking, a hayride, a corn maze and an obstacle course. Gerry, the scarecrow, will tell the children a story about the life cycle of a pumpkin.
